# **Education offers a bright future**

We believe that good education is vital for a bright future and are providing a happy and secure environment where children learn, share and play together regardless of gender, religion, physical or mental ability. A lively and fun time was had visiting the teachers and 192 children at the BOHCM Primary & Nursery school.

In addition to their own language, the children are also taught English and we encourage our staff to develop friendly and supportive relationships with the children's caregivers and local community. Caregivers are encouraged to understand and be involved in their



child's education and also support teaching in the school by reinforcing good behaviour and a desire to learn. The first group of children will graduate from Primary Two in December and in order for them to continue education of this quality we are planning to construct a Primary Three classroom.

Apart from teaching the children the Hokey Cokey, our enthusiastic team set about painting classrooms, delivering teaching materials, installing display boards and ensuring every child received a clothing item, a simple gift that brought such joy.



## Sporting start

A weekend was dedicated to a BOHCM Youth Football & Netball Tournament with one thousand people attending these exciting events. The

football pitch was strimmed by hand, the lines painted with old engine oil and the teams were ready to kick off, while the girls excitedly started their netball matches in a nearby school. The winners and runners up were presented with a goat and happily planned to celebrate together.

In January 2015 we plan to employ two part-time youth workers to work with the most disadvantaged children. We believe that structured sports can help shape children into healthy, social and active people. They will be encouraged to form friendships and learn about important issues such as HIV/Aids while having fun in a safe and relaxed setting.

#### Clean water saves lives



2009 saw the first Protected Spring opened and ready for use by the local community. In September 2014 we opened the nineteenth Protected Spring, built with funds raised by students at South Downs College.

Another pond used by many children was also identified and work to create our twentieth spring will begin soon. UNICEF state that I in 5 children do not have access to clean water, a statistic which only strengthens our vision to provide this facility for as many families as possible.

In 2009 twenty-five children were registered for child sponsorship – five years later this programme supports I38 children including seven with disabilities. Sponsorship works. These children are able to attend school regularly, their diets have improved and they can seek medical help when required.
