# Bridging the Gap

**Dear Friends** We hope this newsletter finds you and your loved ones safe and well. These are certainly challenging times and in the space of a few months all our lives have changed and the Corona pandemic has reached most of the countries in the world. Uganda was very quick to respond to the virus threat by closing their borders and airports and they remain in Lockdown with just a few concessions for travel and work. As we write this Newsletter the schools and churches remain closed and large public gatherings are banned as people are expected to continue with the social distancing guidelines. For many of the poorer people this is simply not possible as their homes are crowded together and water sources and latrines are shared by many people. We are fortunate that the District of Rukungiri where BOHCM works is a rural area and to date Covid I9 has not spread there and the 696 reported cases have been contained in the capital Kampala.

# **Child Sponsorship**

Ben, our BOHCM manager in Uganda, worked hand in hand with the Resident District Commissioner (RDC) and the local police to gain permission for BOHCM to distribute the monthly



support to the families over the past months along with a gift from their sponsors of extra food and soap. One person in each family is allowed to collect their monthly support, giving Ben the opportunity to raise awareness about good sanitation, hand washing and social distancing. Ben reported that many of the guardians shed tears of relief knowing that their sponsorship support is continuing. They also expressed their sincere concerns about people in the UK as the news of our tragic loss of lives reaches them.

# Bridge of Hope Nursery and Primary School

The last few months during our school closure has been extremely difficult for many children who rely on their free school meal. To address this need, our Head Teacher Respa along with Ben identified the most vulnerable families and we are providing them with essential food items to help them through this crisis.

Respa has also been very active in putting together some educational "Holiday Packages" for the primary 7 pupils to ensure they can continue to learn whilst the school is closed. The majority of the school staff have remained at home as required by the Ugandan government.



# Bridge of Hope Children's Village

We are so blessed to have such wonderful House Mothers and Aunts who have risen to the challenge of caring for the 26 children living in the two BOHCM homes.

The children have been encouraged to develop their g and crocheting. The

maize and the RDC gave permission for one of our teachers to visit them and provide some structured lessons. This has been so helpful to the House Mothers who have been with the children nonstop since the Lockdown started. They have already sacrificed so much to be with our children when they have been so concerned about their own families.
