Bridge of Hope Children's Village

At the children's village there have been a few changes. Dinah, one of the House Mothers who joined BOHCM four years ago, requested to retire. Dinah will be very sadly missed by the children and other

staff members but she has promised to keep in touch with the children. We will certainly miss her warm welcome and big smile when next visiting Uganda.

The children were very eager to give Dinah a leaving gift and it was decided that a goat would be a really special gift for her. Ben our Manager in Uganda reported that the



afternoon went well and the children all enjoyed a soda and some snacks. Dinah was thrilled with her gift and couldn't believe the generosity of BOHCM.

After several interviews a new House Mother has now been appointed and we pray that she will settle well and really love the children.



Alice, who has worked at the Children's Village (CV) since the day it opened in 2011 celebrated a very special day with her daughter. Alice was thrilled to arrange and attend her daughters "Give Away" ceremony which is a Ugandan tradition whereby the groom and his family are formally introduced to the Bride's family. The wedding then takes place on another day. Alice said she could never have been able to provide this day for her daughter if it was not for the regular salary and support she receives from BOHCM.

Our youngest child Elijah at the CV recently fell whilst running and fractured a bone in his leg. He was rushed to hospital and his leg was x-rayed and then put in plaster. We suspect that as he came to us as a very malnourished abandoned child that his bones will improve now that he is receiving appropriate nutrition.

Child Sponsorship

Whilst in Uganda in 2015 we were asked to visit a homeless woman called Scovia who was struggling to care for her twin baby girls. Both babies required immediate medical attention and the next day we had found her a small clean place to live. Scovia has been amazing over the



past seven years and has used every opportunity to work hard and bring up her baby daughters. Her sponsor has been faithful in providing monthly support and more recently another donor agreed to build for Scovia and the girls a small house of their own. This family are now happily living in their new home and are just one example of how sponsorship can work.
